2. Induction & Training

Induction is an essential process for anyone starting a new job. This should always include a focus on safeguarding children to help staff and volunteers gain an immediate understanding about its importance, key policies and procedures, as well getting to know who to go to for advice.

Initial and ongoing training is a fundamental requirement for staff and volunteers if children are to be effectively safeguarded and protected from harm.

2.1. We provide induction to new starters that includes information on safeguarding children.

5. Safe Recruitment & Workforce Support

Safer recruitment practice helps prevent adults who are unsuitable to work with children gaining access to them.

Effective organisations ensure that their staff and volunteers have access to specialist advice and support to help them cope with a range of different circumstances.

5.1 Our recruitment process includes a self-declaration by applicants about previous convictions.

6. Ethics, Behaviour & Equality
